

The example sheets more or less follow the same order as the course as given in the full course notes, though not at an entirely uniform speed since some chapters are mostly proofs and do not lend themselves to examples.

Note that the podcasts are subdivisions of the chapters in the course notes and are labelled $X.x$ where $X \in \{1, 2, \dots, 7\}$ is the corresponding chapter and $x \in \{a, b, c\}$.

The rough correspondence between notes/podcasts and example sheets is:

Sheet 1: Chapter 1 (podcasts 1a, 1b, 1c)

Sheet 2: More of Chapter 1, Chapter 3 (podcast 3a for key statements).

Sheet 3: Chapters 4 and 5 (suggest also looking at Chapter 6) and corresponding podcasts.

Sheet 4: Chapters 6 and 7 and consolidation of earlier chapters.

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
